MEET ORANJE

It all started on 30 April 1905, when the Netherlands played their very first international match away against Belgium. And what a start it was. After a dramatic game went into extra time, Eddy de Neve became the hero of the day by scoring all four Dutch goals in a 4–1 victory.

More than 120 years later, Oranje has grown into one of the most recognisable national teams in world football.

The Oranje Legion

Around 800 spectators watched that first international in 1905. Today, millions follow Oranje wherever they play.

Home matches regularly sell out, while major tournaments turn the entire country orange. Streets, squares and stadiums fill with fans in orange shirts, hats and – occasionally – outfits that are difficult to explain.

Dutch fans are famous for bringing colour, noise and a positive atmosphere. At home and abroad, the Oranje Legion travels in huge numbers, creating the sea of orange that has become known around the world.

So if you see orange taking over the city on matchday, you know what's happening: Oranje is in town.





HISTORY

Few fixtures in international football have as much history as the Netherlands against Germany. The rivalry has produced unforgettable moments, dramatic matches and plenty of goals. Recent meetings have been just as competitive. Here's how the last five played out.

Stadium Tours

There are no stadium tours available on the day before Matchday and Matchday itself. Tours starting again from the day after.

GETTING TO THE STADIUM

Public Transport

We strongly advise you to use public transport to get to the stadium. The fastest way to travel from and to the city centre is by using metro line 54 at **Strandvliet-ArenA station**. This station is located near entrance K. If you are travelling by train, you can get off at Bijlmer ArenA station.

Please schedule your journey via the [NS website](#) or via [9292](#). Use [OVpay](#) or use a ticket machine to buy your public transport tickets.

Parking Cars (P2)

Visiting team fans are advised to park on P2. From there it's a short walk to the stadium entrance. It's not possible to pre-book a parking ticket for P2 and you can pay at the entrance. After parking, fans are advised to purchase their exit ticket immediately. This prevents queues at the payment machine after the match and avoids having to join the vehicle queue again when leaving P2.

Navigation address: Borchlandweg 1, 1114 BD Amsterdam

- Payment: €23
- Open: from 16:00 on matchday until 2H after final whistle
- Please note that P2 is not suitable for disabled visitors. Disabled visitors can park at P1.

Traffic in Amsterdam might be very busy at this time. Please allow yourself some extra time to reach your destination.

Parking Coaches (P BUS)

When coming by bus/coach fans are advised to park on P Bus. This coach park is only available for buses/ coaches. From there it's a short walk to the stadium entrance. For P BUS it is required to pre-book a parking ticket.

JOHAN CRUIJFF ARENA

The Johan Cruijff ArenA in Amsterdam is the largest stadium in the Netherlands and one of the main venues for international matches of the Dutch national team. Home to AFC Ajax, the stadium has also been an iconic stage for Oranje for more than 30 years, hosting many memorable international matches.



GENERAL STADIUM INFORMATION

Opening time

The stadium will be open 2H prior to kick-off (18.45). Please be advised to arrive early at the stadium: 19.15 at the latest.

Country Support Only

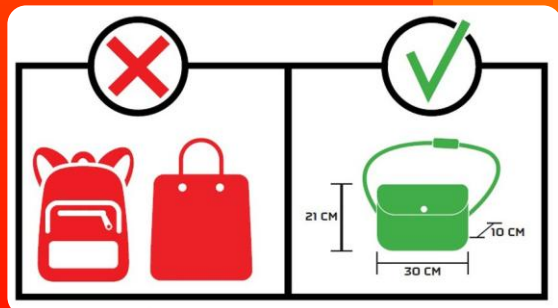
Clubshirts or any other club badges are prohibited. Support your country!

Food & Drinks

There is no possibility to bring your own food and drinks inside the stadium. Beer will be sold in the stadium. In the Netherlands it is allowed to bring beer into the stands.

Bags

Bags larger than A4-size (30x21x10cm) are not allowed into the stadium. There are **no storage** facilities or lockers at the venue.



Cashless Stadium

The Johan Cruijff ArenA is a cashless stadium, this means that you can only pay by using debitcard, creditcard or mobile pay options.

Flags

Flags or banners larger than 1x1 meter need to be impregnated. Please show the fire certificate upon arrival. Flags with religious/political nature will not be permitted.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited inside the stadium.

Fireworks

Setting off fireworks is prohibited.

Drones

The Johan Cruijff ArenA is located in a no-fly zone. It is therefore prohibited to fly drones in, above, or in the vicinity of the stadium. For detailed information about the areas where drone flights are permitted: <https://map.godrone.nl/>

AWAY SECTOR

The entrance for the away sector is gate K. The away fans are located in sector 415, 416 and 417. To ensure a smooth ingress, away fans are advised to arrive at the stadium early.

PLEASE NOTE: BE AROUND THE STADIUM AT THE LATEST 90 MINUTES PRIOR TO KICK-OFF (19:15)

Voucher exchange point

- The voucher exchange point is on P-Risk. This is the parking lot next to the entrance of the away section.

Banners and Flags

- Flags and banners larger than 1 x 1 metre must be made of fire-retardant material or treated with a fire-retardant substance. Please bring a valid fire-safety certificate. At the entrances each flag and banner will be checked by the stewards.
- The space for displaying them is limited.

F&B and Toilet facilities

- The toilets and catering facilities are on the concourse behind the away sector.
- Beer will be sold in the stadium. Beer purchased inside the stadium may be taken into the stands.

After Final Whistle

- Normally there is no hold-back procedure. In case of a hold back procedure the Security Officer or SLO will be informed accordingly by the KNVB.
- Excellent public transport service to the city centre or airport.
